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Frequently Asked Questions FAQ's for a Parklet Permit

Who can apply for a Parklet?

Business owners, property owners, and community-based organizations (CBO) may be considered.

How do I apply for a new Parklet permit?

Applicants can apply for a permit at the [Online Permit Center](#), by emailing DOTOnlinePermits@oaklandca.gov, or by appointment at the Permit Counter. The OakDOT Permit Counter is open to the public on the 2nd Floor of 250 Frank H. Ogawa Plaza. Click [here to schedule an appointment](#).

How much does a Parklet permit cost?

Parklet permit costs are documented in the [Master Fee Schedule](#). New Parklet permit fees include an application fee, records management/technology fee, along with fees to cover OakDOT staff time to review the application, OakDOT staff time to inspect the installed Parklet, and an annual parking space rental fee.

Does the Parklet permit expire?

Yes, each Parklet permit expires after 365 days. Permittees should apply to renew their Parklet permit prior to its expiration date to avoid stop work orders, additional fees, penalties, or delays in renewal.

Can the City help fund the Parklet?

Parklet costs are eligible for City of Oakland I & Tenant Improvement Program funds. [Check their website](#) for more information on the next call for applications.

I have an existing parklet, can I keep it?

All Flex Street permits issued under the previous Flex Streets Program expire on June 30, 2023, per [City Council direction](#). The [Parklet Program Guidelines](#) then take effect on July 1, 2023. Flex Street permit holders are required to apply for a new Parklet permit and meet the new Parklet Program Guidelines. During the COVID-19 Pandemic, the City of Oakland provided streamlined permitting options for outdoor spaces to help Oakland businesses recover from the economic impacts of COVID-19, called the Flex Streets Program.

Is there a grace period for existing permittees?

OakDOT plans to start enforcing the new Parklet permit after September 1, 2023. OakDOT is committed to supporting businesses during the transition to the permanent Parklet Program. What is the difference between a Sidewalk Café and Parklet?

Both Sidewalk Cafés and Parklets activate streets by accommodating outdoor dining in the public right-of-way. For the purposes of this application, a Sidewalk Café is distinguished from a Parklet in that a Sidewalk Café is located on the sidewalk area within the business frontage whereas a Parklet is designed to occupy parts of a parking lane located within the business frontage. Sidewalk Cafés shall be approved via a separate [Minor Encroachment Permit](#).

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What are the City's Standard insurance requirements?

Contact your insurance company and have the City of Oakland added as an Additional Insured to your Commercial General Liability Insurance policy. The minimum amounts specified in such public liability policy or policies shall be \$300,000 for each occurrence for public liability insurance and \$50,000 for each occurrence for property damage insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 00 01).

The Additional Insured language should name "the City of Oakland, its Councilmembers, directors, officers, agents, employees and volunteers" as insureds under your commercial general liability policy. General Liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Vendor's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 (11/85) or both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 forms, if later revisions used). If you submit the ACORD Insurance Certificate, the insured status endorsement must be set forth on an ISO form CG 20 10 (or equivalent). A STATEMENT OF ADDITIONAL INSURED STATUS ON THE ACORD INSURANCE CERTIFICATE FORM IS INSUFFICIENT AND WILL BE REJECTED AS PROOF OF MEETING THIS REQUIREMENT.

How were the new Parklet Program Guidelines developed?

The City of Oakland Parklet Program Guidelines were developed based on lessons learned from Oakland's temporary pandemic-era Flex Streets Program, as well as best practices gleaned from thirteen peer cities, including San Francisco, Seattle, Los Angeles, New York, Washington, D.C., Boston, and Philadelphia. To refine the Parklet Program Guidelines, OakDOT staff hosted a series of office hours in July 2022 and solicited feedback from Oakland's Business Improvement Districts, existing Flex Streets Program permittees, regional agencies, and community members. OakDOT staff received over 170 survey responses and letters from stakeholders. A summary of this outreach can be found [here](#).

Can neighboring businesses apply for and build a single parklet, spanning across multiple storefronts/business frontages?

No, in accordance with the [Parklet Program Guidelines](#), a single parklet may only occupy up to two parallel parking spaces –or three diagonal spaces, that are located in front of the permittee's business frontage. This is to ensure that minimum setbacks and emergency access to businesses are maintained between the sidewalk, parking lane, and vehicular lanes. Neighboring businesses are encouraged to coordinate materials and design with adjacent parklets to create a more integrated streetscape but should regardless still apply via separate applications for each parklet.

What does a Parklet permit entitle me to?

Parklet permits are issued to owners of abutting businesses and represents a revocable permission for the permittee to occupy public space. The permittee never gains any ownership of the public space. They only own, and are responsible for, the facility that is to be installed within the public space [i.e., the parklet]. The City of Oakland allows abutting business owners to establish these parklets for their exclusive use and are not required to make their parklets available to those who are not their customers.

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HOW ARE PARKLET PERMIT FEES CALCULATED?

The fees for a Parklet Permit issued from OakDOT are calculated based upon the approved City of Oakland Current Master Fee Schedule.

This written consent shall be documented at each permit renewal for the parklet. Note that non-consent from a neighbor does not constitute an automatic rejection of an Application for Parklet Permit or renewal.
