choice through an informal poll held at the end of the event to engage youth civic participation.

OYAC encourages the informed and active participation of citizens in government, working to increase understanding of public policy issues, and influences public policy through civic education or advocacy. We encourage all eligible youth under 18 to preregister to vote. As a reminder, eligible voters are able to register to vote at <a href="RegisterToVote.ca.gov">RegisterToVote.ca.gov</a>. To submit a ballot, return completed ballots by mail, in person to an Accessible Voting Location, a ballot drop-off box, or authorize someone to return the ballot on your behalf.

The OYAC and ACC do not endorse political parties or candidates.
